



HOCKLEY HEATH ACADEMY – PUPIL PREMIUM REPORT 2018 - 19

INTENTION STATEMENT

Pupil Premium is funding received by the academy specifically focused on addressing the inequalities between disadvantaged pupils and their peers. The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to work with disadvantaged pupils who have registered for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years, Looked-After Children (CLA) and children of service personnel. The academy uses this funding to ensure that all disadvantaged students achieve their potential and are supported in diminishing the difference compared to their peers. The following document details specific actions together with costs and impact for each element of our Pupil Premium spend. DfE guidance states that the grant may be spent for the purposes of the school ie for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school.

REVIEW 2017-18

END OF KS2 ATTAINMENT AND PROGRESS SUMMARY

There were 3 pupil premium pupils in the year 6 cohort. 1 out of the 3 pupils were SEND as well as disadvantaged and received additional interventions on top of the classroom teaching.

ACHIEVED THE STANDARD – COMBINED

2 out of the 3 pupils met the standard in reading, writing and maths.

ACHIEVED THE STANDARD

2 out of the 3 pupils met the standard in reading.

2 out of the 3 pupils met the standard in writing.

2 out of the 3 pupils met the standard in maths.

END OF KS1 ATTAINMENT

There was 1 pupil in the year 2 cohort. The pupil did not meet the standard in reading or writing but did meet the standard in maths.

PHONICS – YEAR 1

There was 1 disadvantaged pupil who took the phonics screening check in year 1. This child passed the screening check.

PHONICS – YEAR 2

There was one disadvantaged pupil in year 2 who needed to retake the phonics check. Following regular intervention, he passed the check.

EYFS

There were two disadvantaged pupils in Reception. Both pupils achieved GLD at the end of FS2.
